The academic day is divided into six one-hour blocks and students receive instruction in Reading, Writing, Math, History and Science. During the senior year, Science is replaced with Vocational and Community Exploration where students participate in disability awareness discussions, Human Sexuality, Health, and begin to explore the vocational world. Students also have elective classes such as physical education, art, drama, technology, music and musical theatre.

Life-Changing

Riverview School is an independent coeducational boarding/day school on beautiful Cape Cod, Massachusetts. We are committed to developing student competence and confidence in academic, social and independent living skills. We offer middle school, high school, post high school transition and summer programs.

- Riverview is committed to developing students' academic abilities, and to helping them acquire and apply knowledge. Students are grouped in small classes, and the student-to-teacher ratio never exceeds 8 to 1. Coursework is supported through the latest technologies and innovations in teaching. Specialized speech and language services, reading instruction, executive function coaching and social skills training are infused throughout the program.
- Students continually engage in academic curriculum, residential programming, and community experiences designed to build the skills they need to live as independently as possible. Each student is assigned an advisor who serves as a liaison between home and school and provides support with self-advocacy, self-awareness, problem solving and social skills.



Students come from 21 states and 8 foreign countries, as well as the Cape Cod community.

Experience

- Riverview supports students to build confidence, establish positive relationships, understand and regulate emotions and develop self-advocacy skills. Students gain greater independence through developing problem solving strategies and building strong support systems. Students have many opportunities to practice social skills.
- Riverview's Wellness Program focuses on the benefits of keeping active, healthy eating and being mindful. Riverview is committed to embracing wellness as a community, and to ensuring that students are developing and internalizing habits that will guide them to independently make healthy choices throughout their lifetimes.

At Riverview, students are accepted for who they are. They are kind and support each other. For many students, attending Riverview is the first time in their lives that they feel true acceptance and enjoy friendships and busy social lives.





Middle School

Becoming Part of a Team

Middle School serves students ages 11-15, grades 6-8. Students experience a sense of accomplishment that comes from becoming part of a team. They begin to understand the passage of time, organization, and the importance of self-regulation. They are given tools and taught step-by-step strategies to apply in their academic, social, and life experiences.

- Classroom instruction for Riverview's youngest students is designed to build the foundation for learning.
- Students take part in content-driven, hands-on projects related to a theme while strengthening their investigation, research and writing skills.
- Lessons focused on problem solving with peers help to further independence.
- Members of Riverview's Language and Social Development Department co-teach social skills classes.
- Students learn and live in collaborative settings designed to allow them to build relationships and understand their emotions and other people's perspectives.
- Staff work closely with students in order to guide them in developing self-advocacy skills and identifying their support systems.

High School

Celebrating Talents and Developing Strategies

Riverview School's High School Program serves students ages 14–19, grades 9–12. Students celebrate their talents and abilities while developing strategies for managing challenges. Whether they are in the classroom, residences, community, or on the playing fields, students learn the importance of hard work, collaboration, and perseverance.



- Lessons are presented via a thematic, integrated curriculum.
- Literature, writing, hands-on history activities, the arts, and field trips are all connected to a central theme.
- Social skills instruction is provided in natural group settings, such as in the cafeteria, classroom, dormitory and during activities.
- Students practice independent living skills related to cooking, shopping, personal hygiene, health, nutrition and fitness, stress management, and the planning of recreational activities.
- Skills such as room and dorm care, daily living, time management, organization and budgeting are taught in structured, supported settings, helping students to stretch and grow.

Post High School Transition Program

Preparing Students for Independent Lives

Riverview School's Post High School Transition Program GROW—Getting Ready for the Outside World for young adults ages 17–21. Structured much like a college campus, GROW students live in dorms, take classes and participate in an extensive internship program. They learn how to self-advocate, make mature choices and take responsibility for all aspects of their lives, including selecting and planning their own social activities.

- GROW students play a very active role in designing and planning their lives.
- The GROW curriculum includes direct instruction in academics with courses that include: Communication and Literacy, Personal Finance, Travel Training and Transition Seminar.
- Students further develop skills related to: cooking, comparative shopping, personal hygiene, health, nutrition and fitness, stress management, home maintenance, transportation, and the planning of independent recreational activities.
- Students identify and explore career interests with hands-on training through robust internship programs. They develop a strong work ethic and gain firsthand experience in a variety of work settings, thereby increasing awareness of personal strengths and interests.

Summer Program

Activities, Adventures and Academics

The Riverview Summer Program is five-weeks full of adventures, activities, learning and fun!

Riverview Summer offers programs for three different age groups: Middle School, ages 11-15; High School, ages 14-19; and the Post High School Transition Program, ages 17-21.

For Middle/High School students, the Summer Program is designed to build social skills and independent living skills while strengthening academic progress achieved during the school year, whether coming in for the new school year or just joining us for the summer.

For Post High School (GROW) students, the Summer Program is designed to teach vocational, social, and independent living skills while reinforcing academics. GROW students must be enrolled for the following school year in order to participate in the Summer Program.

WHAT IS PROJECT SEARCH?

Project SEARCH is a unique school-to-work transition program. Our focus is on employment preparation as total workplace immersion facilities a combination of classroom instruction and hands-on training through worksite rotations in 3 area hospitals - Cape Cod Hospital, Falmouth Hospital and Spaulding Rehab Hospital. The Project SEARCH model involves an extensive period of skills training, innovative adaptations, job coaching, and continuous feedback from teachers, skills trainers, and employers while working approximately 25 hours per week at the host sites.

BENEFITS TO THE STUDENTS:

- Participate in (3) 10-week internships, in varied settings, within the host businesses
- Acquire competitive, transferable and marketable job skills
- Gain increased vocational strengths and interests
- Learn to integrate into a workplace and its culture
- Build further independence, teamwork, problem-solving, confidence, and self esteem
- Obtain work-based individualized, direct coaching, instruction and feedback

WHO IS SELECTED FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROJECT SEARCH PROGRAM?

- All students entering their final year at Riverview School go through a file review process to determine an individualized pathway for their final year of vocational development
- Some criteria for placement in Project SEARCH include students who are motivated to work competitively and who have strong independent living, self-advocacy and self-determination skills

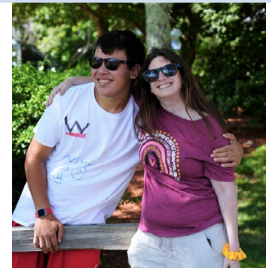
